

Reflection Paper - Due Sunday April 7th at 11:59 pm

25 marks total, 10% of your final grade

The goal of this reflection paper is to think a little bit *differently* about the material that we have covered in this class. There are no incorrect answers in a reflection paper: the goal is for you to make connections between the course content and your experiences and opinions. Your mark in this paper will reflect (see what I did there!) how well you answer the following questions (**5 marks for each answer**):

- 1) Since taking this course, how are you more aware of the processes of physical geography that shape the world you live in? Give an example!
- 2) Was there a topic or aspect or even a single fact in this course that really stood out for you? What made it so interesting? And if the answer to this is “nothing, really”, then try to explain why.
- 3) Are there aspects or topics in the course that left you more *curious*? If so, describe them briefly and what interests you about them.
- 4) What concepts, if any, covered in this course *challenged* knowledge you had coming into this class? If none, explain why.

- Dedicate some time to *reflect* on these questions without distractions, and then open an empty Word or Google doc and answer each of them in a single paragraph (max. 200 words each).
- You don't need a cover page, just put your name and student number at the top of the page.
- Your overall style/clarity/grammar will be assessed (**5 marks**)
 - As this is a reflection, first person responses are encouraged and expected.
 - Spelling or grammar mistakes should be minimal.
 - If you use content not covered in the course, you must properly cite it and reference it. Any referencing format is fine, as long as you are consistent.
 - Ideas should be presented in a logical order.
 - Paragraphs should be properly constructed. See the ASC handout on paragraph structure:
